

Transfer Advising Quick Guide

Transfer Basics

- Max # of credits from a 2-year institution = 66 credits (<u>16.5 units</u>)
- Max # of credits from a 4-year institution OR between a 2-year and 4-year institution = 96 credits (24 units)
- Most courses will transfer if a min. grade of "C" has been earned
- Prior grades will determine if a course may transfer, but the actual grade does not transfer to TCNJ. Transfer coursework will read "T" instead of an actual grade on the TCNJ transcript.
- All transfer students begin at TCNJ with a 0.00 GPA.
- Why a course may not have transferred...
 - Earned lower than "C" grade (or lower than required grade for transfer)
 - Course was completed ungraded (Pass/Unsatisfactory)
 - Course was developmental (lower than 100 level)
 - o Student exceeded max. number of transfer units
 - A final transcript was never received

Quantitative Reasoning	

- FYS requirement (for Freshman Level Students) waived if a student:
 - transferred (or will transfer) 7.5 or more units (30 credits)
 - completed an entire first year at a four-year institution
 - completed a content based, first year seminar course at a four-year institution that was worth at least 3 credits (transfer course may need further review; contact: Dr. Kit Murphy)
